Charitable Donation

The surviving family or individual honored will receive a letter announcing that a gift has been made by you in their name. The amount remains confidential.

Planned Giving

This simple term encompasses many different forms of giving. Planned giving is a gift given for any amount, given for any purpose, which requires the assistance of a professional staff person, attorney or financial advisor to complete. It includes gifts which are carefully considered by a donor in light of estate and financial plans. Planned giving includes such giving options as: wills and bequests, life insurance plans; charitable annuity trusts; charitable remainder trusts; and many others.
